

GLOBAL ALLIANCES AMIDST TURMOIL

Lukashenko in Islamabad

Belarusian President Alexander Lukashenko's threeday official visit to Pakistan, from November 25 to 27, 2024, at the invitation of Prime Minister Muhammad Sharif. holds significant Shahbaz diplomatic importance despite receiving limited public attention. The visit was overshadowed by ongoing political turmoil and protests in Islamabad, where the arrest of former Prime Minister Imran Khan had sparked unrest. As protesters clashed with law enforcement, high-level discussions between the delegations of Pakistan and Belarus took place in the Minister's House, reflecting Pakistan's focus on maintaining its international commitments amid domestic challenges.

Diplomatic circles view the visit as a notable step in Pakistan's foreign policy, particularly in the context of strained Western relations with Russia. Belarus, a key ally of Russia, shares close ties with Moscow, and Lukashenko is considered a trusted confidant of Russian President Vladimir Putin. Given this backdrop, the visit attracted considerable interest from Western capitals, which continue to monitor Islamabad's evolving international alignments. Some analysts suggest that Pakistan's outreach to Belarus signals an effort to diversify its foreign relations and reduce reliance on traditional Western allies, particularly as the country grapples with economic challenges and seeks to secure financial support from the International Monetary Fund.

This year marks the 30th anniversary of diplomatic relations between Pakistan and Belarus, a milestone that both nations celebrated by reaffirming commitment to strengthening bilateral ties. Prime Minister Shahbaz Sharif acknowledged Belarus's active participation in the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation Council of Heads of Government Meeting hosted by Pakistan in October 2024. Both sides agreed to deepen inter-parliamentary political dialogue, enhance relations, and expand trade and economic cooperation. Discussions also emphasized the importance of regional economic integration and connectivity, with both nations expressing a shared resolve to create a sustainable and comprehensive partnership.

Economic collaboration featured prominently in the talks, with agreements to promote joint ventures in agriculture and industry, particularly in the production of high-tech agricultural machinery. Recognizing Belarus's advanced capabilities in agricultural manufacturing and Pakistan's agrarian-based economy, the two nations identified significant potential for mutual benefit. Efforts were also directed toward addressing trade barriers and regulatory challenges to facilitate smoother market access for key sectors such as pharmaceuticals, health products, and industrial goods.

The discussions extended beyond economic matters to address critical international and regional issues. Both leaders expressed grave concern over the escalating conflict in the Middle East, including the devastating humanitarian crises in Gaza and Lebanon. They called for an immediate, unconditional, and permanent ceasefire, stressing the need for the uninterrupted delivery of humanitarian aid and a peaceful resolution of disputes in accordance with United Nations resolutions. Pakistan also briefed Belarus on the situation in Jammu and Kashmir, reiterating its stance on resolving disputes peacefully under the UN Charter and Security Council mandates. The leaders jointly reaffirmed their support for the Palestinian people's right to self-determination and the establishment of an independent Palestinian state based on the two-state solution.

The visit also highlighted science, education, and culture as priority areas for enhanced cooperation. Both nations agreed to strengthen ties between their scientific communities through joint research initiatives under the Joint Commission on Science and Technology. They acknowledged the progress made over the past decade in science and technology and outlined plans for collaborative projects in this domain. Education was another focal point, with both sides committing to expanding academic cooperation, facilitating student exchanges, and fostering cultural ties through art, music, literature, and other people-to-people programs.

During the visit, Pakistan and Belarus signed 15 important agreements and Memorandums of Understanding, including a "Roadmap for Comprehensive Cooperation between the Islamic Republic of Pakistan and the Republic of Belarus for the period 2025–2027." These agreements aim to formalize and expand collaboration across various sectors, including trade, technology, agriculture, and culture.

The discussions also touched on the global implications of technological advancements, emphasizing the transformative role of artificial intelligence and its potential to reshape economies and international relations.

The visit concluded with President Lukashenko expressing gratitude to Prime Minister Shahbaz Sharif and the people of Pakistan for their warm hospitality. He extended an invitation to the Prime Minister to visit Belarus at a mutually convenient time, signaling a deepening of ties between the two nations. While the visit took place against the backdrop of domestic unrest and international conflicts, it serves as a reminder of Pakistan's commitment to pursuing a proactive foreign policy aimed at fostering global partnerships and ensuring regional stability.

In the pursuit of peaceful resolutions to international disputes and the development of Pakistan's economy, the visit of President Alexander Lukashenko to Islamabad, coupled with the successful hosting of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization Heads of Government Meeting in October 2024, stands as a testament to the government's diplomatic achievements in challenging times. However, the significance of these accomplishments has been overshadowed by the tumultuous backdrop of political unrest, marked by tear gas and the clamor of protests in the streets.

The Pakistani nation aspires not only for the peaceful resolution of international conflicts but also for stability and harmony within its own borders. Addressing internal disputes with the same determination shown in international diplomacy is essential to creating a unified vision for the country. Only then can Pakistan's strong foreign policy and international commitments resonate effectively on the global stage, fostering economic growth and securing a prosperous future for its people.

FROZEN HOPE

The Winter Agony of Gaza's Displaced Millions And Struggle for Survival

The United Nations has described the upcoming winter in Gaza in the most sombre terms, warning of "diminishing conditions for survival." With a Mediterranean climate, Gaza's winters bring cold, rain, and dampness, creating harrowing challenges for a population already battered by relentless conflict and deprivation. For those whose lives have been reduced to mere survival, the misery of being perpetually hungry, wet, and cold intensifies the struggle to stay alive.

The destruction in Gaza is staggering 60 percent of residential buildings and 80 percent of commercial infrastructure have been demolished. Nearly 90 percent of Gaza's population, about 1.9 million people, are now displaced within the enclave, with many forced to move multiple times. Since October alone, an estimated 131,000 people have been driven out of their homes, highlighting the scale of collective suffering. Everyone in Gaza has lost everything, livelihoods, and even the semblance of stability.

Winters are especially unforgiving for war-affected families living in makeshift shelters. Thin canvas tents offer little defense against the biting cold, with icy winds slicing through their fragile walls. Warm clothing, blankets, and heating are luxuries beyond reach for most. Children and the elderly, the most vulnerable, face heightened risks of hypothermia and respiratory illnesses. The cold, combined with limited access to food and clean water, exacerbates their hardships, making every winter night a desperate battle for survival. This situation underscores the urgency of global solidarity and the need for immediate humanitarian assistance.

As rain begins to fall in November and December, it brings with it the risk of disease. Those forced to sleep outdoors or in overcrowded shelters face exposure to water-borne illnesses such as cholera, dysentery, typhoid, polio, and Hepatitis A. Heavy flooding could further contaminate water supplies, compounding the public health crisis.

The blockade that has suffocated Gaza since June 2007 has left its people resourceful yet tragically underresourced. In northern Gaza, the area hardest hit since the outbreak of the recent Israel-Hamas conflict, bakeries and communal kitchens have been shut down. Essential services like water provision, nutrition support, and sanitation are virtually nonexistent. Reports describe families relying on nothing but jackets for warmth, as simple winter supplies like socks or shoes are unaffordable in a shattered economy. Even used clothes in local markets are prohibitively expensive for many.

International law defines adequate housing as a fundamental human right, guaranteeing security of tenure and protection against eviction or destruction. Article 11(1) of the International Covenant on Economic, Social, and Cultural Rights recognizes housing as an essential component of the right to an adequate standard of living. Yet for millions in Gaza, housing has become an unattainable ideal, a distant memory of what life once was. As the United Nations reminds us, "Housing is a right, not a commodity."

Gaza's plight is a stark reminder of the human cost of prolonged conflict and blockade. The international community must act urgently to alleviate the suffering of a population enduring the compounded cruelties of war and winter. Without immediate intervention, the coming months will deepen the despair of an already devastated people, challenging the world's conscience to uphold the basic rights and dignity of those caught in the crossfire of history.

achievements, lingering disappointments, and ambitious plans for the future. The negotiations, centered on climate finance and global action, yielded critical, though insufficient, outcomes to address the growing challenges of climate change.

Key Outcomes

1. New Climate Finance Goal

Delegates agreed to a new finance target of at least \$300 billion annually by 2035, tripling the







previous goal. This includes public and private finance, with a broader objective of mobilizing \$1.3 trillion annually to meet the needs of developing nations. Despite the progress, the figure remains well below what is required to support low-carbon transitions and shield vulnerable communities from climate impacts.

2. Global Stocktake and Fossil **Fuel Transition**

COP29 failed to build on COP28's historic call for transitioning away from fossil fuels. Discussions on fossil fuel reductions and the broader Global Stocktake outcomes were deferred to future negotiations, frustrating many stakeholders.

3. Carbon Markets and Adaptation

Progress was made in operationalizing the Paris Agreement's Article 6 on carbon However, adaptation markets. discussions were marred by disagreements on implementation indicators, leaving critical decisions to be revisited at COP30.

4. Loss and Damage Fund

Additional pledges brought the fund's total to \$759 million, far short of the \$580 billion annual need by 2030. Key decisions on incorporating loss and damage national plans postponed.

5. Collaborative Initiatives

Notable pledges included reducing methane emissions from organic waste, scaling global energy storage, and forming "continuity coalitions" to sustain momentum across sectors like health, food systems, and urban climate action.

Challenges and Frustrations

developing nations Many frustration expressed over insufficient financial commitments from wealthier countries and the absence of concrete plans to limit global warming to 1.5°C. The failure to finalize a comprehensive strategy for adaptation and equitable finance distribution highlighted deep divide between the developed and developing nations.

Next Steps: The Road to COP30

The coming year will be pivotal as countries prepare for COP30 in Belém, Brazil. Key priorities include:

- Strengthening Climate Finance: Implementing the \$300 billion goal, enhancing financial system alignment with climate needs, and innovative finance exploring mechanisms.
- Submitting Robust NDCs: Nations must unveil new. emissions-reduction ambitious targets for 2035 and align these with transformative policies.
- · Advancing Adaptation Goals: Finalizing global adaptation indicators and securing greater support for vulnerable nations.
- Operationalizing Carbon Markets: Ensuring transparency and efficacy in carbon credit trading under the Paris Agreement framework.

COP29 laid a foundation but underscored the urgent need for ambition heightened and collaboration to address the escalating climate crisis. The focus now shifts to turning promises into tangible action, with COP30 serving as a critical milestone in this journey.





The Need for Trade and Religious Tourism Revival Between Pakistan and India Insights from Asfandyar Bhindara

He suggested that such initiatives should be extended to other religious sites to promote peace and better understanding between the two nations.


